At Kinship Carers Liverpool we can help and support you, offer advice and guidance and put you in touch with other kinship families

What is Kinship Care?

A kinship carer is someone who is looking after someone else's child because their parents are unable to care for them. You might be a grandparent, auntie, uncle, sibling or friend. You might be caring for very young children or teenagers. You might be new to kinship caring or you may have been doing it for many years. Every kinship family situation is different.

Who are Kinship Carers Liverpool?

Kinship Carers Liverpool is a registered charity based at Ellergreen Community Centre. We used to be known as Parents Against Drugs and Alcohol (PADA), supporting families affected by substance misuse. We now work with kinship families across Liverpool, raising awareness of the issues affecting kinship families and offering bespoke support.

How can Kinship Carers Liverpool Help you?

Kinship caring is both rewarding and challenging. Some families face difficulties at different stages of the kinship family journey. You are caring for others but who is caring for you? We are here to give you advice, information and support. We provide an Activities Programme for kin kids and carers – and can introduce you to other kin families locally.
